The audited accounts for the Club as at 30 June 2024 (which is operated by the company Carlisle United Association Football Club (1921) Limited) will show a very significant strengthening of the finances of the club: • Net assets of £10.9m up £2.1m (from £8.1m at 30 June 2023). This is before circa £6m capital investment additions since 1 July 2024 in the current year • Overall profit of £2.8m (reflecting the £2.5m Purepay external debt repaid by CSG and then forgiven) - as detailed • External debt was reduced to just £0.2m (a fall of £2.8m - reflecting £2.5m debt forgiven by CSG and other repayments) • Cash in hand of £0.8m at 30 June 2024	Accounts approval for the year ended 30 June 2024 will take place in Q1 2025 with public filing at Companies House before 31 March 2025.	31 Mar 2025
