Q5 Can ST holders benefit from ticket deals when they happen e.g. voucher for a pint?	Historically, the club has limited ticket deals to one per season to avoid upsetting season ticket holders. Given the adverse feedback from season ticket holders regarding the second ticket promotion and the impact on their value – we will review the offers in future.	
Q6 Can the team-sheet be shown in a box on the FZ screen so the football match can still be watched	We have been trialling putting the team on the big screen. We cannot show in a window at present – we are looking at further IT investment to allow that in 25/26. Given the feedback we will review.
