## Delivery

It was brilliant to be involved in Stanwix School's Health Week at the start of July. Our staff were present on three days, delivering introductory sessions on golf and athletics to a wide range of ages. This was key to giving the children experiences of different sports, providing new ways they can keep active and healthy in their free time..

**We** have also been heavily involved with numerous local schools end of term parties with our staff taking the inflatables to Kingmoor Junior School, William Howard School and Lanercost Primary School.

Our Summer Activities 2025 have been another fantastic success with over 1000 children attending our provision across July and August. We have travelled all across the county to deliver our Summer Activities, taking in eight locations in Cumbria: Carlisle, Cockermouth, Kendal, Keswick, Maryport, Penrith, Whitehaven and Wigton. It's been brilliant to have multiple player appearances across the six weeks with Morgan Feeney, Josh Grant, Sam Hetherington, Jude Smith and Gabe Breeze taking the time to sign autographs and complete a questionand- answer session with our participants.

We have launched our brand new matchday provision Olga's Matchday Kickabout with the first session taking place before the Blues played Boreham Wood at Brunton Park on Saturday 16 August. It was amazing to see many children come down to our free football session and they got to meet Jordan Jones and Sam Hetherington, who came down to sign autographs.

**Carlisle** Youth Zone invited us to deliver mini-medics to participants at their holiday provision, helping them gain vital life skills.











### **Education**

Carlisle United Community Sports College's Girls Football Development Scholarship team have collected their trophy, having won the Community and Education Football Alliance Small Sided Women's North League in June. Eight of the players involved in the titlewinning team came down to Brunton Park to collect the trophy and medals, with three unable to make it on the day. The Girls' side pipped a strong Birmingham City side to the title by two points, after an incredible unbeaten run which began at the end of January. They

won 13 out of 18 games across the season, drawing two and only losing on three occasions, scoring 44 goals during the campaign. This was an outstanding achievement, being the first ever solely Girls' team and then proceeding to win the league on the first time of asking despite having never played with each other before the season began.

The 2023-25 Football Development Scholarship cohort had official confirmation of their grades in August. There were some outstanding results that all the learners can be proud of and some exciting times ahead as they move onto higher education, apprenticeships, scholarships and employment. These provided some outstanding stats as follows: 100% of learners finished above their target grade, 20 learners achieved the highest possible grade, 100% retention of students over the two years and very high value added relating to academic grade. On top of this, all first years are currently above their target grade moving into their second year. For a second year running, all our learners leave with outstanding BTEC results, meaning all 47 students in the last two years have exceeded their targets.







## Inclusion

Our Veterans and Silver Foxes had an enjoyable trip to Watchtree Nature Reserve at the start of July, where they got their helmets on and cycled around the area before enjoying refreshments in the cafe.

The end of the Football For All season saw the group celebrate another year of fun and football with a visit to Hollywood Bowl. Our participants had a superb time with some impressive high scores on the board. They also enjoyed some food and drink after the bowling.

as they visited Carlisle Subscription
Bowling Club. They absolutely loved the opportunity to work on their bowls skills and learn more about the club.

We have been shortlisted in two

categories at the Diverse Cumbria
Awards 2025. The Club and CST are

exemplary EDI initiatives on matchdays
and within the community. Additionally,
EDI Lead Teresa Mulholland is
individually shortlisted for the Positive
Role Model Award for her coordination of
EDI activities. This recognition underlines
the dedication of all involved in

championing EDI through impactful events and best practices throughout the 2024/25 season. EDI Lead Teresa Mulholland, said: "I am incredibly honoured to be shortlisted for the Positive Role Model category at the Diverse Cumbria Awards.
